



The number of women elected to serve in Minnesota's local governments has increased since 1982. As a result of the 2006 general election, the percentages of women serving as school board members and city council members reached all-times highs.

- ◆ Of 2,248 public school board members in Minnesota, 845 (37.6%) are women.<sup>1</sup>
- ◆ Of 3,554 total city council members in Minnesota, 999 (28.1%) are women.<sup>2</sup>
- ◆ Of 854 mayors in Minnesota, 113 (13.2%) are women.<sup>2</sup>
- ◆ Of 457 county commissioners in Minnesota, 52 (11.4%) are women.<sup>3</sup>
